Earl Willis presented a Resolution supporting improvements to the U.S. Highway 50 corridor. The Commissioners will consider the Resolution at the September 4, 2007 meeting.

Dick Beasley, representative from the 25th Judicial District Community Corrections Board, presented a Carryover Reimbursement Plan to the Commissioners. Commissioner Schwieterman moved that the FY2008 Carryover Reimbursement Plan of the 25th Judicial District Community Corrections Board be approved. Commissioner Puckett seconded and the Motion was approved unanimously.

The repairs to the Health Department building and the Museum building were discussed. Commissioner Schwieterman reported that the Economic Development Director, John Kennedy, would be starting work on September 4, 2007.

There was no update on the salvage yard from the County Attorney.

Don Paddock of Paddock Enterprises discussed the completion of the swimming pool renovations.

Commissioner Puckett moved that warrants in the amount of \$291,012.84 be approved. Commissioner Braddock seconded the Motion and it was unanimously approved.

As there was no more business to come before the meeting, Commissioner Schwieterman moved for adjournment. Commissioner Braddock seconded and the meeting was adjourned at 10:25 a.m.
